Sermon Title: Our Resurrection Hope

Sermon Date: 17 August 2025

Reference Text: 1 Corinthians 15:1-8, 20-26, 51-58

SERMON RECAP

- We live in a troubled and uncertain world, but the Bible reminds us that true hope is found in Jesus Christ.
- The resurrection of Jesus is the central pillar of our Christian faith. It assures us of our future resurrection and eternal life with Him.
- This hope not only shapes how we see our present troubles but also calls us to live with eternal purpose today.
- 1. What is the Christian's hope?
- Paul reminds the Corinthians of the Gospel: Jesus died for our sins, was buried and rose again on the third day. (v1-8)
- Verse 20 declares Christ as the "firstfruits". Believers who have "fallen asleep" (died) will one day be resurrected into new bodies at His coming (v. 23).
- This is the Christian's hope: Death is not the end. In Christ, we will be raised to new life together with Him.

- 2. How does it shape my response and attitude in difficult times?
- If resurrection is our certain future, it reshapes the way we view present struggles.
- Knowing the bigger picture helps us endure. Though troubles, pain, and loss are real, they are not the final word.
- Even prayers that seem unanswered today will ultimately be fulfilled in eternity. For example, while we may not see full healing now, we are promised a new body that will never fall sick. (v51-53)
- We need to WILL ourselves to draw strength from God's promises. We need to live by Scripture, not by our emotions or circumstances.
- 3. How should I live my life now in the light of my future hope?
- Jesus' mission was the salvation of mankind. As His followers, we are called to make disciples wherever He has placed us.
- This present life is our only opportunity to invest in eternity. Serving God is not wasted effort, but it is a privilege.
- True hope does not guarantee comfort but empowers us to live fruitful lives even in troubled times.

- 1. What comes to mind when you think about hope? How is Christian hope different from the way the world thinks about hope?
- 2. How has the truth of Jesus' resurrection encouraged you in your own life?
- 3. How can this hope practically shape the way you handle stress, disappointment, or loss today?
- 4. What does it mean for you personally to "live with eternal purpose"? How might your daily decisions, relationships, or work look different?

PRAYER

- 1. Thank God for the resurrection of Christ, which secures our future hope.
- 2. Pray for strength to endure present troubles by holding on to God's promises.
- 3. Ask for wisdom and courage to live fruitfully for God in every aspect of life.
- 4. Pray for friends and family who do not yet know Jesus, that they may come to share in this hope.
